Kia ea te wāhanga ki a koutou mātū atu ki te orokotimatanga i whānau mai ai koutou otirā anō tātou te tangata.

Kati, nei rā te takapou kōrero ka hora. E takoto ake nei ngā kōrero mō te whakatau i ngā take e pā ana kit e Tiriti o Waitangi, me te huarahi kei mua i te aroaro hei takahitanga mā tātou o Ngāti Maruwharanui. E kore hoki e taea he mate nō te iwi kotahi!

Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru, through the Negotiations Team, has been negotiating with the Crown since 2016 in relation to the settlement of the historical claims of Ngāti Maru. With the initialling of the Deed of Settlement in August 2020, the members of Ngāti Maru now have the opportunity to vote on whether to accept the proposed Deed of Settlement.

We, the Trustees of Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru and the Negotiations Team, strongly recommend that Ngāti Maru members vote to accept the proposed Deed of Settlement. Adult members (aged 18 years and over) of Ngāti Maru are therefore asked to vote on the following resolution (set out on your voting paper):

I, as a member of Ngāti Maru, agree:

- to accept the Ngāti Maru Deed of Settlement, Te Hiringa Taketake.*
- that Holden Hohaia, Tamzyn Pue, Bronwyn Koroheke, Eileen Hall, Raymond Tuuta, Sam Tamarapa, Anaru Marshall, Nathan Peri, Prescilla Paretutaki Hayward-Howie, Jamie Tuuta, and Rowena Henry sign the Deed of Settlement on behalf of Ngāti Maru.*

Overview of Treaty Settlement

Claimant Definition of Ngāti Maru

Ngāti Maru is the collective group composed of individuals who descend from one or more of the Ngāti Maru tupuna, including the following hapū:

- Ngāriki
- Ngāti Hinemokai
- Ngāti Kopu/Kopua
- Ngāti Kui
- Ngāti Maruwharanui
- Ngāti Tamakehu
- Ngāti Tamatapu
- Ngāti Te Ika

Historical Treaty of Waitangi Claims

If Ngāti Maru iwi members vote to ratify the Ngāti Maru DOS, it will be the full and final settlement of all historical Treaty of Waitangi claims of Ngāti Maru resulting from acts or omissions by the Crown prior to 21 September 1992.

The Ngāti Maru DOS will settle the following historical Treaty of Waitangi claims, as they relate exclusively to Ngāti Maru:

- Wai 136 - Ngāti Maru Land Claim
- Wai 1609 - Ngāti Maru (Burrows and Hohaia) Claim

The Ngāti Maru DOS will also settle the following historical Treaty of Waitangi claims, in so far as they relate to Ngāti Maru:

- Wai 54 – Ngā Iwi o Taranaki claim:

Crown Offer as Presented in the Deed of Settlement

This section summarises the key aspects of the Crown offer. The Crown offer to settle historical Treaty of Waitangi claims is made to iwi in the form of a Deed of Settlement. If approved by our iwi members, Ngāti Maru will receive a settlement package which contains:

- Crown Acknowledgements and Apology
- Historical Account
- Cash Quantum
- Commercial Redress
- Cultural Redress

Crown Acknowledgements and Apology

The DOS includes:

- an agreed account of the historical relationship between Ngāti Maru and the Crown;
- the Crown's acknowledgement of its acts and omissions which have breached Te Tiriti of Waitangi/ the Treaty of Waitangi and its principles or caused prejudice to Ngāti Maru; and
- a Crown apology for those breaches of Te Tiriti o Waitangi/the Treaty of Waitangi and its principles.

Cash Quantum

Ngāti Maru will receive a cash quantum amount of \$30 million; this includes the \$15 million on account payment that was already paid to Ngāti Maru following the signing of a deed on-account on 28 August 2018, and a further \$1 million to be paid upon initialling of the deed of settlement.

Commercial Redress

The Commercial Redress mechanisms included in this Crown Offer are:

- Crown Forestry Licensed Land
- Deferred selection properties
- Right of first refusal

Crown Forestry

Ngāti Maru will receive Te Wera Crown Forestry Licensed Land as Commercial Redress. The transfer value of the forest is deducted from the quantum but this is then offset by the accumulated rentals received for the forest land.

Deferred Section Properties

The Deferred Selection process mechanism allows Ngāti Maru to buy, if it chooses to, Crown assets from a defined 'pool', within a period of time after settlement date (shortly after the Settlement Legislation is passed).

If approved by our iwi members, Ngāti Maru will secure deferred selection on the following properties as Commercial redress:

- Sale and leaseback properties (land only):
- 3 of 5 school sites (land only), deferred selection for a period of 2 years
- Stratford Police Station (land only), deferred selection for a period of 5 years
- Pohokura and Makahu Farms (landbank properties), deferred selection for a period of 5 years
- 29 landbank properties deferred selection for a period of 3 years

Right of First Refusal

Right of First Refusal (RFR) is a settlement mechanism that provides Ngāti Maru the first opportunity to purchase surplus Crown land within a defined 'pool'. If approved by our iwi members, Ngāti Maru will secure RFR on the following properties as Commercial redress:

- Exclusive RFR over 58 properties
- Shared RFR with Te Korowai o Wainuiārua and Ngāti Hāua over 6 properties
- Shared RFR with Te Korowai o Wainuiārua over one property

In addition, Ngāti Maru will secure a RFR in relation to fisheries introduced into the quota management system after settlement date.

Cultural Redress

Cultural redress recognises traditional, historical, and spiritual associations of Ngāti Maru with places and sites. The Cultural Redress mechanisms included in this Crown Offer are:

- Vesting of sites – sites of cultural significance to be transferred (vested) to Ngāti Maru as cultural redress.
- Statutory acknowledgements and deeds of recognition – A statutory acknowledgement recognises the association between Ngāti Maru and a particular site or area and enhances the iwi's ability to participate in specified resource management processes. Deeds of recognition oblige the Crown to consult with Ngāti Maru regarding their management of certain areas.
- Relationship redress – relationship agreements with various agencies detail how Ngāti Maru and the agency will work together; letters of introduction are sent to other organisations aiming to raise the profile of Ngāti Maru and encourage organisations to engage on matters of particular importance to Ngāti Maru.
- Natural resources redress
- Other cultural redress.

Vesting of sites

Ngāti Maru will receive the following sites as Cultural Redress:

- 7 sites in fee simple
- 3 sites in fee simple as a scenic reserve with Ngāti Maru as administering body
- 3 sites in fee simple as a historical reserve with Ngāti Maru as administering body
- 1 site in fee simple as a recreation reserve with New Plymouth District Council as the administering body.
- 1 site in fee simple as a local purpose (esplanade) reserve with Stratford District Council as administering body
- 1 site in fee simple as historic reserve, with Ngāti Maru and Ngāti Hāua as joint administering body

Statutory acknowledgements and Deeds of recognition

Ngāti Maru will receive Statutory acknowledgements and Deeds of recognition over 19 sites, and statutory acknowledgements over three further sites. Full list of sites can be found in **APPENDIX I, page 21**.

Relationship redress

Ngāti Maru will receive the following relationship redress:

- 5 Relationship agreements
- 1 Fisheries protocol
- 1 Letter of relationship
- 22 Letters of introduction

Natural resources redress

Ngāti Maru will receive the following Natural resources redress:

- Maru Taiao Plan
- Joint Management agreement
- Rights to remove pākohe and pūrangi from public conservation land

Other cultural redress

Ngāti Maru will receive a Cultural revitalisation fund over and above the cash quantum. This amount is the balance of \$1.5 million once transfer of cultural redress sites is taken into account.

How the Settlement Package will be Managed

Post Settlement Governance Entity

A Post Settlement Governance Entity (PSGE) is the entity that receives and looks after settlement redress received from the Crown as part of the claimant group's historical Treaty of Waitangi settlement.

In May 2018, Ngāti Maru members ratified the Te Kāhui Maru Trust as the PSGE. Ngāti Maru members agreed that:

- Te Kāhui Maru Trust will be the PSGE to receive and manage the historical Treaty of Waitangi settlement redress on behalf of Ngāti Maru;
- Te Kāhui Maru Trust receive a payment of \$15 million on-account of the financial redress amount;
- Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru Trust will be dissolved by the settlement legislation; and
- the assets and liabilities of Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru Trust will be vested in the PSGE.

Te Kāhui Maru Trust

As set out in the Trust Deed, the key purpose of Te Kāhui Maru Trust is to receive, administer, manage, protect and govern the iwi assets on behalf of Ngāti Maru.

As provided for in the Trust Deed, Te Kāhui Maru will specifically:

- Receive, hold and manage settlement property for the benefit of the members;
- Receive, hold and manage Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru assets and functions;

- Maintain and establish places of cultural or spiritual significance to Ngāti Maru;
- Promote the educational, spiritual, economic, social and cultural advancement or well-being of Ngāti Maru and its Members;
- Provide for the on-going maintenance and establishment of places of cultural or spiritual significance to Ngāti Maru and its Members;
- Undertake commercial activities to support the object and purpose of the Trust; and
- Any other purpose that is considered by the Trust from time to time to be beneficial to Ngāti Maru.

Registered members of Ngāti Maru will appoint Trustees through a regular election cycle. Iwi members will be kept up to date through regular public notices and meetings. The Trust Deed is available online at www.maru.nz or from our office.

What happens to Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru?

Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru is the current mandated entity representing Ngāti Maru historical Treaty of Waitangi claims. Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru was established as the representative body of Ngāti Maru in 2010. We were unable to use Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru as the PSGE for Ngāti Maru to receive settlement assets from the Crown.

After the completion of the settlement, Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru will be dissolved and the assets and liabilities of Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru will be transferred and vested in Te Kāhui Maru by the Māori Land Court.



Ratification Process

The term “ratification” refers to the process of securing formal consent or support from iwi members for the signing of the DOS.

Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru Trust and The Negotiations Team are seeking agreement to ratify the proposed DOS from Ngāti Maru members.

The Crown also needs to be satisfied that the DOS has been formally ratified by a sufficient number of iwi members in an informed and transparent process.

Ratification Information Hui

Five ratification information hui will be held to ensure that all members of Ngāti Maru have the opportunity to be informed about the DOS and the voting resolution, which is summarised in this booklet. The ratification hui are also an opportunity for members to ask questions about the DOS and the ratification process.

Independent Crown Observers

Te Puni Kōkiri staff will attend the ratification hui as Independent Crown Observers. Their role is simply to observe the hui and take notes of questions asked and answered. They are not permitted to participate in the hui in any other way.

Details of the ratification information hui dates are set out below:

Independent Returning Officer

To ensure the integrity of the ratification voting process, the Trust has engaged electionz.com to act as an Independent Returning Officer to conduct the ratification voting process for Ngāti Maru members. The role of the Independent Returning Officer includes:

- Acting as the Independent Returning Officer to receive, collate and count all votes;
- Cross-referencing voting papers with information held on the Ngāti Maru register database;
- Managing special votes and registration forms; and
- Submitting a written report to Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru once the ratification process has concluded.

The Ratification Voting Process

Registered adult members (aged 18 years and over) of Ngāti Maru are being asked to vote on the following resolution:

I, as a member of Ngāti Maru, agree:

- to accept the Ngāti Maru Deed of Settlement, Te Hiringa Taketake.
- that Holden Hohaia, Tamzyn Pue, Bronwyn Koroheke, Eileen Hall, Raymond Tuuta, Sam Tamarapa, Anaru Marshall, Nathan Peri, Prescilla Paretutaki Hayward-Howie, Jamie Tuuta, and Rowena Henry sign the Deed of Settlement on behalf of Ngāti Maru.

Eligibility to vote

All adult registered members (aged 18 years and over) of Ngāti Maru are eligible to vote. Any registered members who turn 18 years old during the voting period will also be eligible to vote. All registrations are reviewed by the Whakapapa Validation Committee.

If you are not yet a registered member, you can vote by contacting the Independent Returning Officer on the free phone Election Helpline 0800 666 029 or iro@electionz.com for a special voting pack.

Please note: you must be a registered member of Ngāti Maru in order to vote in the ratification process.

Voting papers

All eligible voters will be sent a voting pack on **9 September 2020**. Votes can only be made using the official standard and special voting papers or unique internet voting codes, provided by the Independent Returning Officer.

If you lose or damage your voting paper, please contact the Independent Returning Officer on the Election Helpline 0800 666 029.

How to vote

The voting pack you receive will provide details on how you can vote. Votes can be made by:

- Placing a special vote tbc by electionz.com at the conclusion of any of the ratification information hui;
- Voting online by following the instructions in your voting pack; or
- Posting your completed voting form to the Independent Returning Officer, PO Box 3138, Christchurch.

Voting period

The voting period will run from 9.00am on **Wednesday, 9 September 2020** to 12.00pm on **16 October 2020**.

To be counted, votes must be received by the Independent Returning Officer by 12.00pm on Friday, 16 October 2020 or by envelope date-stamped Friday, 16 October 2020 by the Post Office and received within three (3) working days of the closing date.



Special votes

The provision of special votes has been made for people who either:

- turn 18 years old on or before the voting closing date; and/or
- register during the voting period on or before the voting closing date.

The following process will be followed regarding the receipt and process of special votes:

- each special voting form will use a unique identifier referencing which of the special conditions the person is voting under. If a member is not registered, they must complete a member registration form with their special vote.
- the independent returning officer will be present at each ratification hui to advise members on registration and special voting, and accept any special votes cast at each hui.
- special votes will be counted by the independent returning officer subject to eligibility being confirmed by the Whakapapa Validation Committee.

Confidentiality

Voting is by secret ballot. All completed votes (either paper or electronic) go directly to the Independent Returning Officer. No other party will have access to the information on them. Voting papers will be destroyed by the Independent Returning Officer ninety (90) days after the close of the vote.

Notification of results

As soon as the Te Rūnanga o Ngāti Maru has been notified of the outcome of the DOS ratification process and the Crown has accepted the results, the voting results will be made available to Ngāti Maru members and the public:

- by public notice in the Taranaki Daily News;
- on email;
- on the Ngāti Maru website: www.maru.nz; and/or
- on the Ngāti Maru Facebook page.

Information regarding the DOS signing ceremony will be confirmed to iwi members through our website, Facebook and email.

A 'Maru Taiao plan' (an iwi management plan under the Resource Management Act 1991) to guide environmental planning and decision-making within the Ngāti Maru rohe.

A joint management agreement to provide for:

- some of Taranaki Regional Council's environmental monitoring responsibilities over the Waitara River to be delegated to the Waitara River Committee, to enable this function to be exercised jointly with those iwi who have interests in the river;
- enhanced consultation with the iwi members of the Waitara River Committee in relation to resource consent applications, and opportunities to have input into planning documents, regarding the Waitara River; and
- for Ngāti Maru to be notified of any environmental issues with abandoned petroleum wells, or consent applications for mining activities, should they come to the attention of Taranaki Regional Council.
