As part of their training the tauira spent a day at Lake Rotokare, learning about pest control and trapping. When checking all the traps around the outside of the perimeter fence of Lake Rotokare a weasel and rabbit were caught – so that is two less pests in our taiao.

The forestry course concludes with their graduation on 8th December 2022 at Stratford Senior Citizens Hall. This is always a special event, celebrating success.

Our kaimahi are now busily working with employers to enable the tauira an opportunity to head straight into mahi or further training.
