It is time for our quarterly pānui for Tupu ā nuku. So much has happened this Summer with a lot of wonderful opportunities for our rangatahi.

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Our Kaimahi had the opportunity to spend time with Department of Conservation (DOC) and a new cohort of tauira who are engaged in a six-month programme with DOC. Tupu ā nuku are supporting these tauira and we spent the day working alongside them spraying noxious weeds and collecting rubbish that just gets dumped on our beautiful whenua. We are planning on taking other Tupu ā nuku tauira out with Department of Conservation to help ensure Papatūānuku is thriving.

As part of our engagement with our tauira, we took some out to Wilkies Pools for a hikoi and reflective time. It was so awesome to see these young people actively engage and share stories whilst out on our beautiful maunga. A valuable lesson was learnt about being prepared for any weather changes; this is also a valuable life lesson to be prepared for obstacles that will always come up in life. Taking time to pause, breathe and be out with papatūanuku is so good for everyone's wairua.

Tupu ā nuku were fortunate to receive four funded spaces with Taranaki horses helping humans. The team took rangatahi out to Warea for two, three-hour sessions. Our rangatahi learnt about body language, communication skills, breathing techniques and how to be calm, which they all then demonstrated working with their horses. It was so exciting to hear that one of our rangatahi had a job interview after attending these sessions and successfully secured mahi. We are looking forward to using HHH for our other rangatahi who would benefit from this awesome kaupapa.

Since starting this kaupapa we have supported 16 taiohi with passing their learners licence, support coming in the form of 1 on 1 study, practice tests, road codes, and paying for fees.

We have also supported 6 taiohi passing their restricted licence, providing lessons through 2Drive and paying for test fees.

TAIMANA TAEPA

Taimana engaged with Tupu ā nuku (TAN) early in 2022 after the kura he was attending did not meet his needs. The team worked with Taimana, and he successfully completed his Level 1 and 2 with Te Kura correspondence school.

During this time, he actively engaged with TAN and attended many wānanga from confidence building with horses, a day out with Kaimahi at Lake Rotokare, hikoi, work experience on a dry stock farm in Ureti, work experience at Blue Duck station in Tauramanui, a week's work experience on a sheep station with Jack Jordan. Taimana grew in confidence and maturity every time he engaged with TAN.

We are delighted that he has now secured his dream position as a Junior Shepherd on a large sheep station in Taihape. We continue to offer support to Taimana and his whānau.
